



Checks on Majority Power May Limit Majority Tyranny, but Madison Did Not Consider that They May Also Empower a Collection of Minority Tyrannies




* "Extend the sphere, and you take in a greater variety of parties and interests; you make it less probable that a majority of the whole will have a common motive to invade the rights of other citizens; or if such a common motive exists, it will be more difficult for all who feel it to discover their own strength, and to act in unison with each other."

 James Madison, Federalist No. Ten Making It More Difficult to Assemble a Majority to Tyrannize a Minority Also Makes It More Difficult to Assemble a Majority that Is Being Tyrannized by a Minority

Small Interest Groups Tend to Have Lower Transaction Costs (Starting with the Cost of Identifying Members of the Group) than the Larger Public

As Milton Friedman points out, wherever farmers are the majority, they are exploited by the minority, but where farmers are the small minority, they exploit the majority (through farm subsidies, for example)

+ Concentrated Benefits, Diffused Costs **Rational** Sheer Ignorance **Belief in Magic** for Power, Prestige, and Other People's Stuff

But Sometimes Government Grows, Not Incrementally, but in Quantum Jumps

- A Crisis Is a Great Opportunity to Expand Government Power
- The Mentality of "We Together" (Especially When "We" Are against "Them") Creates an Identification Between the Ruled and their Rulers and a Greater Willingness of the Latter to Submit to Greater Impositions

Crises Not Only Speed the Process, but Can Undo in a Year the Progress of Centuries



The "Ratchet Effect"


 When a Jump in Governmental Size or Power is Made, It Does Not Return to Its Previous Condition




Federal Budget Growth Since 1850

Dollars




So Let's Look at the Federal Budget as a Percentage of GDP

Crises -- especially Wars -- Distract Attention from Domestic Problems and Unify Factions Behind the Leadership



Crises Call for "National Unity," i.e., "Shut Up"



 Once a Government Program Is Instituted, More Interests Are Created for Its Continuation than for Its Elimination




What Role Do the Media Play

The Media Can Contribute to the Unjustified Growth of Government, by: Focusing Only on the "Seen" Benefits and not the "Unseen" Costs Fostering Public Anxiety Creation of "Emergencies" and "Gaps" Problems Sometimes Become Media Causes Only as Social Forces Are Eliminating Them Calls to "Do Something" -- Anything

Sound Journalism Can At Least Balance the Discussion and Introduce Some Rationality

- Figures compiled by the California Taxpayers Association should be a warning to every official in every city, county and board of education in Orange County. The report says that Orange County has the third highest per-capita tax in the state of California ... \$53.19 for every man, woman and child ... an unbearable load crushing the spirit and the sustenance out of" taxpayers. (Nov. 28, 1939)
